
TAC Internal Committees


TAC Internal Committee Structure


Who can apply to be a part of TAC?

Any student or trainee pursuing a degree and registered at a university who has an interest in and commitment to global health

TAC celebrates both ethnic and academic diversity!

We would love to increase our diversity as much as possible

Students and trainees from a variety of academic backgrounds can contribute: medicine, nursing, veterinary science, economics, public health, research, marketing, zoology, law, teaching, social work, etc.







TAC Membership Requirements

- Be an individual or institutional member of CUGH
 - Individual member cost: 5-30 USD/yr. depending on your institution's country income bracket: https://www.cugh.org/individual-membership
 - Institutional member: If your institution is a member, your individual student membership will be free
- Available to engage in TAC activities a minimum of 2-3 hours per week
- Able to commit to TAC for a full 2 years
- Ready and willing to serve in various leadership positions
- Available to attend and volunteer during the annual CUGH conference



TAC Member Responsibilities

- Participate in monthly TAC meetings
- Contribute to collaborative projects that further the goals of TAC
- Assist with annual CUGH Conference
- Attend at least 70% of all meetings
- Actively communicate with your peers





TAC Leadership Opportunities

TAC members may be called on to lead in various ways...

- Serve as Chair and Chair-Elect of TAC
- Serve as an Internal Committee Team Lead
- Lead a TAC Collaborative Project
- Lead a project on the CUGH committee they serve on
- Interact directly with CUGH Secretariat and/or CUGH Board of Directors
- Serve as a point of contact with organizations outside of CUGH (TAC Chair)





Most Important: The TAC Mindset!

- It may seem like a lot, but as a team we try to
 - Recognize and remember that we are students first!
 - Keep our limitations in mind
 - Openly communicate and be very honest about how much time we have to contribute to various projects and whether various deadlines are realistic considering our school timeline

Frequently Asked Questions

- When can I apply? The Next Application cycle for the TAC 2023-2025 cohort opens on August 3, 2022 and closes on September 30th, 2022
- Where can I find the application? Follow us on Instagram, Twitter, and/or Facebook to get more details regarding the link to the actual application!
- If I get accepted, when would I start? Though the applications take place in the fall, applicants accepted to the program do not officially start their TAC year until after the conference the following year. If you are accepted this fall 2022, your TAC term begins April 2023 and ends April 2025
- What do I do while waiting for my TAC year to start? New TAC members will spend this time being oriented through a handbook, webinars, etc.
- When is the next CUGH Conference? April 14-16, 2023

Description and Goals of the CRP

- Network of students who serve as representatives of CUGH on their respective campuses.
- Relationship of a CR and CUGH:
 - Inform CUGH/TAC on institutional/student needs and interests
 - Increase CUGH/ TAC's reach and provide support to TAC-related projects (e.g. advocacy, research)
 - Receive custom resources and guidance from CUGH





Benefits

- 1. Opportunities to work with CUGH on volunteer projects.
- 2. Advocate for important CUGH issues on your campus.
- 3. Serve as a direct liaison between your institution and CUGH.
- 4. Represent your institution in one of the largest global health academic consortiums.
- 5. Spotlights in social media, etc.
- 6. Access to CUGH CRP curated resources.
- 7. Free individual membership to CUGH if your institution isn't already a member.
- 8. Access to CR exclusive networking opportunities.

Requirements and Eligibility

Requirements for the 2022-2023 year*:

- 1. Actively participate in at least one of the Campus rep projects listed in the application.
- 2.Be the primary liaison between your campus, student population and CUGH's Trainee Advisory Committee.
- 3. Participate in CUGH and TAC activities, and invite other students to do the same.
- 4. Share CUGH & TAC projects with local students interested in Global Health.
- 5. Help mobilize your student body to support CUGH & TAC advocacy efforts.
- 6. Gather campus students' feedback about advocacy issues important to them.
- 7. Provide ideas for solutions to various Global Health issues.
- 8. Create and maintain a list of contacts of students and student groups interested in Global Health to facilitate information sharing and development.

Requirements and Eligibility


Eligibility to be in the CRP:

- 1. Be a trainee/student for the next full year.
 - a. If you are graduating in May, you are allowed to continue throughout the end of the cycle (July 2023).
 - ы. Faculty are also accepted into the CRP program.
- 1. Collaborate (if applicable) with other representatives at your institution to achieve your CRP requirements.




Targets for the CRP for 2022-2023

Enrollment process:


- 1. Fill out the new enrollment survey based on whether you are a new or existing representative. The survey should take you 10-20 minutes to fill out.
 - a. Continuing Campus Reps: Fill out the survey linked here
 - ы. **New Campus Reps:** Fill out the survey linked <u>here</u>
- 2. You will receive confirmation shortly after of your survey from a TAC representative from the Campus Representative committee.





How are TAC and the CRP Connected?







TAC vs CRP

- Being a TAC member does not mean you are a member of the CRP
- Being a CRP member, does not mean you are a TAC member
- You can however apply to be both a TAC member and a CRP member and serve in both programs
- If you apply to TAC and are not accepted, you will automatically be offered a chance to be a part of the CRP.





TAC vs CRP: Requirements and Responsibilities

TAC

Eligibility: CUGH student members only

CUGH Membership: Must be a member *before* applying to

TAC

Time Requirement: 2-3 hrs/ week minimum

Duration: 2 years

Type of Position: Global health international student

representative

Responsibilities: Represent students from around the world, contribute to the growth and inner workings of TAC and the CUGH mission

Size: Max 25 students/trainees can serve on TAC

Applicants/institution: Generally 1 applicant will be

accepted per institution

Benefits: Free Conference Attendance, regular monthly interactions with CUGH member experts, leadership opportunities on global projects

CRP

Eligibility: Any Student/Trainee/Faculty Member

CUGH Membership: Not required - Free CUGH

membership after becoming a Campus Rep

Time Requirement: 2-3 hrs/ month minimum

Duration: 1 year (or more)

Type of Position: Global Health **institutional** representative

Responsibilities: Represent your institution and

communicate w/TAC regularly, volunteer your time to

TAC/CRP projects and initiatives, disseminate CUGH

advocacy materials

Size: No limit

Applicants/institution: Multiple applicants will be accepted

per institution

Benefits: Access to CRP network and resources, opportunities to volunteer w/TAC, free CUGH individual membership
