

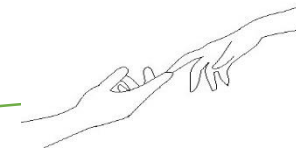
Comprehensive Mentorship Program for Health Care Improvement in Kono District, Sierra Leone

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Background: The Kono District in Sierra Leone faces significant health challenges, including high maternal and child mortality rates, a growing burden of non-communicable diseases (NCDs), and persistent issues with TB/HIV, mental health, and healthcare infrastructure.

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Objective: To enhance the quality of healthcare services in Kono District through targeted mentorship.



Methods: on-site training, remote consultations, workshops, train-the-trainer model, needs assessment.

Conclusion: This mentorship program is creating sustainable improvements in Kono District's healthcare by building local capacity. Future efforts will focus on expanding the mentor pool, integrating the program into existing systems, and addressing challenges like staff turnover.

Result

- Trained over 100 healthcare workers
- 40% improved adherence to clinical guidelines
- 25% reduction in maternal mortality
- 30% increase in accurate lab test results
- Strengthened data management practices
