Insights & Analysis

- Democrats show very strong support for foreign assistance (75 support, 11 oppose, 12 neither), and messaging further solidifies this support with 80% favoring foreign assistance on the informed ballot.
 - Support is initially strongest among voters 55+, college educated voters, and Progressive Democrats.
 - Opposition is initially strongest among voters under 55, non-college voters, and Traditional Democrats.
- After messaging, support increases +5 to reach 80%, and opposition remains extremely low at 8% (-3 from initial).
 - Men under 55, Traditional Democrats and those in the South are some of the groups that increase their support most.
 - Progressive Democrats increase their already strong support after messaging.
- The most effective messages overall are the Economic Benefits, National Security, and International Orgs/Force Multiplier messages.
 - Among those who are initially unsure about foreign assistance, Racial-Social
 Justice/DEI stands out as most effective.
 - Among those who are initially neutral on foreign assistance, Economic Benefits and Localization both stand out as effective.
- A majority of believe the primary motivation for foreign assistance should be supporting global humanitarian needs, and they tend to trust NGOs (32%) most to manage it effectively.
 - Progressive Democrats and voters 55+ show the most trust in NGOs.



Insights & Analysis

- The types of foreign assistance the U.S. should prioritize are **food aid** (42%) and **human rights** (33%).
 - Health system support (30%) and disaster relief (29%) are also of higher relevance.
- 88% believe it is important for the U.S. to provide foreign assistance, and 81% believe the U.S. is effective in doing so.
 - A plurality of voters (40%) believe the U.S. currently spends about the right amount on foreign assistance. 24% say too much and 25% say too little. More progressive voters believe the U.S. spends too little.
- 43% believe NGOs are more efficient and accountable at implementing foreign assistance, more than the 26% who side with the government.
 - Another plurality believe NGOs should fill the void of current foreign assistance cutting.
- Humanitarian assistance (47%), disaster relief and recovery (36%), and emergency relief and recovery (33%) are the leading preferred terms to describe foreign assistance.
 - A majority believe that foreign assistance can be both humanitarian and strategic for U.S. interests.
- Barack Obama (95 fav, 4 unfav) has an impeccable image, and both the U.S. Military (81 fav, 13 unfav) and NATO (78 fav, 8 unfav) have very strong images. The UN (83 fav, 8 unfav) is also very favorable.
 - Less voters have an opinion of NGOs (51 fav, 10 unfav), but they are favorable to a majority. Men show them the most favorability.
 - USAID (72 fav, 5 unfav) is favorable across the electorate.




Insights & Analysis

- Segmentation analysis identified three voter groups:
 - Low Propensity Voters/Mid Support on Foreign Assistance (35%) show support for foreign assistance that is solidified after messaging. They are the youngest segment, skew female, and are more Progressive than Traditional.
 - High Propensity Voters/High Support on Foreign Assistance (52%) show the most support for foreign assistance. They are the oldest segment, skew female, and are more Progressive than Traditional.
 - Indifferent/Low Support on Foreign Assistance (13%) show the least support for foreign assistance, and messaging doesn't have a particular effect. They are a middle-aged segment, skew the most female, and are more Traditional than Progressive.










Emotive Analysis – Foreign Assistance

- Democratic voters express much more positive emotions than negative emotions about foreign assistance. Trust and joy are the dominant emotions as foreign assistance is welcomed by these voters. There is a connected feeling between foreign assistance and doing the right thing, and there are many mentions of the humanitarian necessity.
 - The negative emotions of anger and fear are much less prevalent, though there are many references to putting America first as opposed to supporting foreign assistance.
- Progressive Democrats tend to have a more immediate and favorable opinion of foreign assistance than and Traditional Democrats. The level of support to opposition is consistent among both groups as the positive opinions of foreign assistance outweigh the negatives.









How to Read a Cygnal Message Map (Example)

Effectiveness (X Axis)


The horizontal position of each messages indicates the message's persuasion power—the most important function. Messages positioned furthest to the right are the most effective in changing a voter's opinion. Pay attention to the effectiveness scale at the bottom and how messages compare graph-to-graph; standard range is 0 to 2.

Net Impact (Y Axis)

The vertical position of each messages indicates the NET impact – or *popularity* – of each message. Messages with **highest position** have the **broadest appeal**. The closer a message is to the **bottom** of Net Impact, the more **drag** it has meaning it can cut against you.


Believability (Bubble Size)

The size of each messages bubble reflects the **intensity** of responses (called *believability*). Larger bubbles reflect a high concentration of respondents choosing *much* more/less likely. This is a **comparative tool** for impact but third in importance of the overall graph.






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Overall




Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: M 55+






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: F <55






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: F 55+








Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: M No College











Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Traditional Democrat






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Progressive Democrat






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Very Progressive






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Somewhat Progressive






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Liberal






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Moderate/Conservative






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Midwest






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Northeast






Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: South








Pro-Foreign Assistance Message Map: Initial Foreign Assistance - Neither Support nor Oppose







Percent Change: Initial to Informed Foreign Assistance






