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BACKGROUND

In collaboration with the University of Washington's Department of Global Health E-Learning Program (eDGH) and Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathology (DLPM), the Certificate Program in Clinical Laboratory Leadership & Management (CPCLLM) comprises **three 10-week asynchronous online courses** aimed to develop leadership abilities, enhance operational management skills, and improve quality control practices for professionals working in the clinical diagnostic laboratory.

METHODS



56 laboratory experts around the globe Weekly assignments | self-assessments Weekly quizzes and discussion forums



Participants are charged fees based on their country's income status:

- \$500 per course (\$1,200 full program)
 for high income countries
- \$200 per course (\$500 full program)
 for low- and middle-income countries





INTERPRETATION

The inaugural launch of CPCLLM was successful. Future program goals include increasing HIC enrollment, developing new courses, exploring site-based models to reduce costs for LMIC participants, and customizing content to address distinct needs of LMIC and HIC laboratory professionals.
